6. What does it mean to say that Jesus is Lord of all (see Acts 10:36)?
7. In Acts 9:17, who appeared to Saul?
8. Who filled Saul with the Holy Spirit?
9. How do we know that the Holy Spirit is a person and not a mere force or power?
10. Who speaks to Philip about the Ethiopian in Acts ch. 8?
11. Who speaks to Peter in Acts 10:19-20? Who sent the men to Peter?
12. Who speaks and sets apart Barnabas and Saul in Acts 13:1-2?
13. In Acts 21, who speaks through the mouth of the prophets?
14. In Acts 21, comparing the utterance of these prophets to those in the Old Testament scriptures, what does the phrase, "Thus says the Holy Spirit" tell us?
15. In Acts 28:25-27, who spoke through the mouth of Isaiah?
16. In Acts 20, what do we learn about the person and work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the early church and in the church in our day?
